



re-enactment of the "Capture of the Clarke brothers, Bushrangers". The weekend will be exciting with street stalls, parades, and at the Court House, a re-enactment of the trial of the Clarke brothers, according to the actual trial transcripts.

On the 9th April members travelled to the old town of Nerrigundah for the

150th Commemoration of the Nerrigundah Raid by the Clarke Gang. A flag bearing ceremony was conducted by Acting Commander Far South Coast Southern Region Kevin McNeil to honour Constable Miles O'Grady who was killed in the skirmish whilst defending the town. Our President Peter Smith also gave a talk on the raid and the perpetrators. Film footage was shown with sound of the Centenary Re-enactment made in 1966.
